Service is run for women by women.

Aims:

To provide free and confidential support to women and girls who have been raped, sexually assaulted and/or sexually abused no matter when or how.

Services:

Immediate and continuing support by telephone. Further support can be given in person where resources allow. Also some women prefer to write, so we also offer letter support. We provide information on police procedures, support women through the justice system and criminal injuries compensation. Workers can accompany women to appointments where requested. We provide training on a range of issues relating to sexual violence to a wide range of agencies, statutory and voluntary. We can be contacted by phone or letter and further help can be given via personal contact when possible. The Centre is run by women for women and we can also offer support to family and friends.

Supporting Women Abused in Prostitution (SWAP) is a multi agency initiative involving the Rape Crisis Centre, GGNHS Trust, Base 75, Strathclyde Police and Routes Out of Prostitution. The aims of the project are to support women in prostitution who have experienced rape or sexual assault, and offer emotional support, practical information and support on health, police, legal issues, assistance to access other services and accompanying women to appointments.

Aims:

To address social inequalities faced by women (and men) by providing a range of services within a gender-sensitive setting. The Centre for Women's Health and other parts of the Initiative provide women-only services.

Access:

For the Centre for Women's Health : open access by self referral, either drop in or appointment. Creche available in the main Sandyford reception : Monday to Friday 10 am - 4.15 pm. Within Sandyford there is full disabled access, and interpreting services can be arranged.

RSI(2)/Connections 2 Counselling (0141 211 6720) offers access to counselling services for women who are involved in prostitution, who misuse drugs and / or who are homeless. It provides outreach counselling within clients' homes or the community. Female counsellors offer the service to women only and encourage women to take responsibility and control of their lives. A service is also provided within **Base 75** to women working in prostitution - a doctor is available every evening (except Saturdays) to offer a range of services including contraception, sexual health screening and advice. Call 0141 211 8160 / 8600 for more information.

The Genitourinary Medicine and Sexual Health Services

provides information, advice and medical services on all sexually transmitted infections (inc. HIV) and related issues, counselling services with health advisers for women and men who have been sexually assaulted or abused.

Health advisers provide a sensitive and supportive service for women (and men) survivors of sexual assault or sexual abuse who wish to be screened for sexual infections. Crisis counselling is available; advocacy in accessing other services within the Sandyford Initiative and beyond; reliable and timely testing for sexual infections including HIV, Syphilis and Hepatitis; antibiotic prophylaxis and Hep B vaccinations where appropriate.
